

John # 104 “Why Can’t You Just Be Like Moses?”

John 6:31-36

The greatest most important moment in history was the cross of Jesus Christ and the invisible part of that event was that virtually no one knew that Jesus went to the cross because of the biblical truth in His human soul and He also endured the cross because of biblical truth in His soul and in His dying moment, He passed on the legacy of biblical truth to His entire Royal Family and that’s how we follow in His footsteps.

Biblical truth pre-existed the human race; it was with God in eternity past and our attitude toward it determines whether we are blessed or disciplined.

Consistency in Bible class is the secret of growing up spiritually and attaining the Greater-Grace life.

A believer who constantly loves Jesus Christ is a Greater-Grace believer who is occupied with Jesus Christ.

There are many tests and pressures to drive us off course causing us to become rebellious which does not glorify God.

But a continued positive response to biblical truth results in tremendous Greater-Grace blessings until death transfers us to eternity.

Motivation in the Christian life must always come from biblical truth residing in our soul inventory.

Abram probably didn’t realize the full extent of God’s promise but clearly, the first prophetic promise God made to him revealed the founder and foundation of the Jewish race and her great national blessings in the future.

From time-to-time, God would reiterate and amplify His everlasting covenant He made with Abraham and his offspring; a covenant which guaranteed the new race a future to look forward to, a purpose now and a title deed to a land of their own.

Jewish ancestry was not the only standard for transmission of God’s promises on which Israel was founded; the spiritual birth of the physical offspring of Abraham was essential for gaining access to God’s promises.

Therefore, the real foundation of the Jewish race is regeneration.

Isaac and Jacob also believed, Esau did not.

In the formation of true Israel, the racial Jew must become the regenerate Jew.

So, Moses became great in the secular sense in 40 years while at the same time, he advanced spiritually to Greater-Grace status.

Great people are grace people who make great decisions in life.

Greatness is in the soul and great people make for great choices in life.

Moses made a decision to refuse the throne of Egypt and in doing so to reject the most

beautiful woman in Egypt and in effect to snub Egypt, one of the most powerful empires in history.

Over a 40 year period, Moses had had a great deal of contact with his own enslaved people, originally through his mother who nursed him and being in the Egyptian palace for those 40 years did not hinder him from taking in biblical truth.

Moses through biblical truth in his soul chose something else: something painful, something filled with misery, pressure and tremendous difficulty.

Moses had to turn his back on the woman he loved at that time; he had to leave all of the great things he had earned and he did it willingly.
