John # 109 "The Bread Which Anyone May Eat" *John 6:46-51*<u>Jesus Christ died for the sins of the entire human race aka Unlimited Atonement; 1st John</u>
2:1-2.

Jesus Christ paid the penalty in full for the sins of all members of the human race, not just for the redeemed who've accepted Him.

All mankind is spiritually dead due to imputed sin: in other words, all sinned when Adam sinned and all were counted guilty because Adam was counted guilty.

If One died for all, that means that we were all dead.

And if the free-will of man is the issue in salvation; will spiritually dead man choose for Christ and live forever with Him or will he choose against Christ and live without Him? The issue at the last judgement (GWT) is Human Good vs Divine Good and this is what Jesus' new disciples are having great difficulty understanding.

The most dramatic moment in history for the individual is the time at which he makes a positive decision expressing faith alone in Christ alone.

In contrast, the Lord Jesus says "I am (lit. keep on being) the Bread of Life; eat Me (express faith in Me, My Work and My Words) and live forever!
