John 7 Summary Conclusions: 1. John 7 validates Jesus' claim to be Messiah.

- 2. The Lord Jesus is received in only one way; by grace alone, through faith alone in Christ alone.
- 3. Jesus Christ is the Prophet spoken of by Moses.
- 4. John 7 proclaims God's loving grace from our example of Jesus Christ, the Just One dying for all unjust ones.
- 5. A committed disciple follows in spite of opposition and even temporary misunderstanding.
- 6. All Church Age believers have the personal ministry of God the Holy Spirit.
- 7. The Lord is on His Father's timetable, no one else's.
- 8. The Lord Jesus is authority-oriented always.
- 9. The Lord loves the lost and He never gives up saying it or demonstrating it.
- 10. The Lord Jesus as our example displays a constant dedication to purpose and an urgency for the Gospel message.
- 11. Jesus divides people because His Words are absolute truth.
- 12. Jesus is the Greater Prophet beyond Moses as He is the object of the Feast of Tabernacles and His provision of eternal living water is greater than Moses' provision of physical water in the wilderness.
- 13. The Lord Jesus brings New Covenant blessings to all who are willing to accept them through believing Him.
